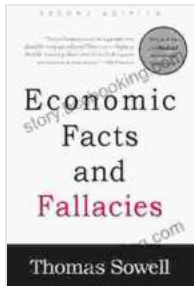

UK Inflation (CPI)



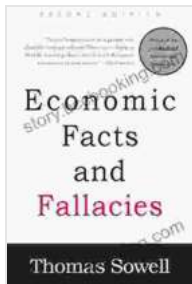

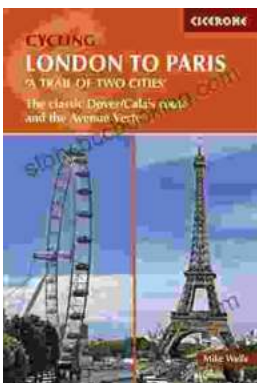
