- inc: increase (2 sc in same stitch)
- dec: decrease (sc 2 stitches together)
- st(s): stitch(es)
- sl st: slip stitch

- RS: right side
- WS: wrong side

Pattern

Body

- 1. Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)
- 2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each st (12)
- 3. **Round 3:** *sc in next st, 2 sc in next st*; repeat * around (18)
- 4. Round 4: *sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st*; repeat * around (24)
- 5. **Round 5-10:** sc in each st (24)

Head

- 1. Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)
- 2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each st (12)
- 3. Round 3: *sc in next st, 2 sc in next st*; repeat * around (18)
- 4. **Round 4:** sc in each st (18)
- 5. Round 5: *sc in next 2 sts, dec*; repeat * around (12)

Legs (make 4)

- 1. Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)
- 2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each st (12)
- 3. Round 3: *sc in next st, 2 sc in next st*; repeat * around (18)
- 4. **Round 4-6:** sc in each st (18)

Tail

- 1. Round 1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)
- 2. **Round 2:** 2 sc in each st (12)
- 3. Round 3: *sc in next 2 sts, dec*; repeat * around (9)

Assembly

- 1. Sew or glue the head to the body.
- 2. Sew or glue the legs to the bottom of the body.
- 3. Sew or glue the tail to the back of the body.
- 4. Attach the safety eyes to the head.




