Kata Tjuta is a great place to go for a walk or hike. There are a number of different walking trails, ranging from easy to challenging. One of the most

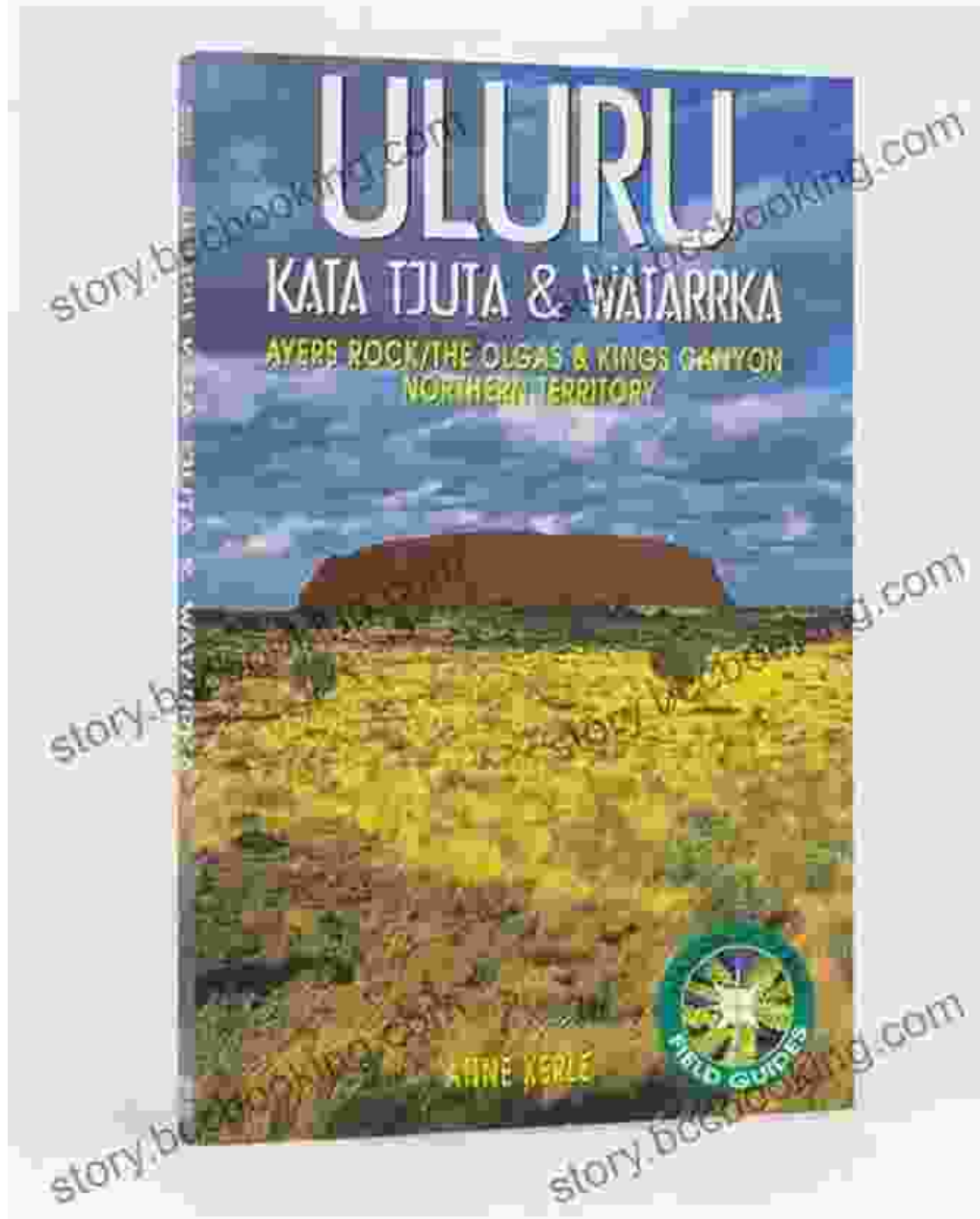
popular walks is the Valley of the Winds walk, which takes you through a stunning gorge and offers breathtaking views of Kata Tjuta.

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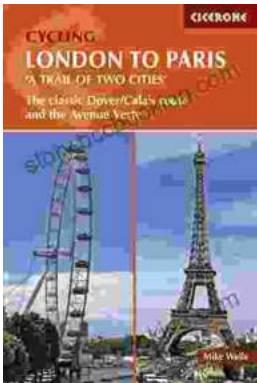
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
